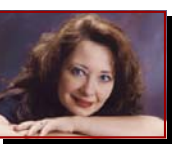

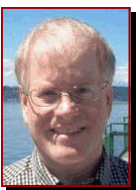

**Walt Wilson, President, Palo Alto Research Group and Author of *The Internet Church*.**

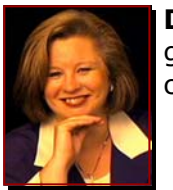
